## Background Information:

*The role of international organizations and local NGOs is crucial in delivering services in Kyrgyzstan. However, poor coordination and lack of synergies among key stakeholders causes duplication of efforts and inefficient usage of resources. Despite a few organizations working with street children no accurate data is available about the exact number of street children.*



## Goal:

- Reducing the number of street children through all-around services
- Coordination of and synergy among key stakeholders working with street children



## Objectives:

- Establish coordination committees at all levels
- Design centralized website containing consolidated information on organizations and efforts made in respective areas
- Improve family support services and develop better child protection systems
- Design youth website and establish youth network
- Assess the needs and support internally displaced children and their families



## Project Outputs:

- Workshop with key stakeholders to discuss and establish platform, do needs assessment, and form partnership
- Series of trainings for government actors on effective coordination and synergy
- Design centralized website containing information about respective organizations including budget and focus areas
- Monthly regional coordination meetings to raise/discuss and address issues arise



## Project Outputs:

- Public awareness
- Conduct research on number of street children
- Train 20 social workers in partnership with Barnardo's Scotland
- Series of trainings on life skills for street children in institutions



## Project Outcomes:

- Established coordination committees
- Coordination and synergy done by government actors
- Data available on street children
- 20 social workers trained and use best practices
- 150 street children trained in life skills, computer literacy and participate in online discussions
- 70 street children reintegrated
